<p>The Old Exchange House &amp; Provost Dungeon are rich in Charleston history. You will be standing in the Old Dungeon where patriots and others were imprisoned as our tour leader will tell stories of the provost dungeon which played a part in the First Revolutionary Congress during the American Revolution. Did you know Charleston had its own tea party?</p> <p>We will then walk to the Old Slave Mart, one block away. Slave traders came to this place to buy and sell enslaved African Americans, an interstate trade that brought wealth to Charleston, the state and region. You will hear about the part these people played in the growth of Charleston and watch a short movie. This is a great place to learn about our early history here in Charleston.</p>

The area will be shaded at times and full sun at other times, narrow at the start and widening as approaching the Edisto River. It is tidal but the current isn't generally too bad. The ACE Basin is home to a diverse group of plants and animals including endangered and threatened species. This trip has been closed since Hurricane Helene came through and blew down dozens of trees into the river, blocking the waterway. It is now reopened thanks to the help of numerous local boaters and fishermen. You’ll meet a friendly team of marine biologists, conservation advocates, and professional shuckers as knowledgeable as they are passionate about the myriad benefits of oysters to the local culture, economy, and ecology of the Lowcountry. Your tour concludes with an oyster-tasting experience featuring single oysters freshly harvested from the farm.</p>

Tom Yawkey, former owner of the Boston Red Sox, left a lasting legacy in South Carolina through his land donation to the SC Department of Natural Resources. Out of this donation, the Yawkey Wildlife Center was born. The property, located on three coastal islands at the mouth of Winyah Bay, encompasses marshes, wetlands, forests, and beaches, offering a haven for wildlife, including migratory birds, eagles, alligators and the threatened loggerhead sea turtle. Over the years, the Wildlife Center has become a refuge for wildlife preservation, providing research, education, field study and protection for endangered species. You will tour this beautiful refuge by bus and learn more about the Yawkey’s love for the outdoors and wildlife. Despite its secluded nature, the Yawkey Wildlife Center stands as a remarkable testament to conservation efforts in the region, offering a unique experience for nature enthusiasts.</p> <p>Entrance to the refuge is limited to ensure ecological conservation and protection of the wildlife sanctuary. Guided tours are only offered seasonally and by appointment only. Minimal walking is required. Participants must be able to board a boat via a short ramp and step on and off a bus. Binoculars and a camera are recommended. Bug spray, long sleeves, long pants are also recommended. Participants may bring a lunch to enjoy on the bus. The Spring 2026 trip to Chessie Creek explored a small portion of the area, and the guide team realized the area had much more to offer. The Chessie Creek winds completely around an island with a series of abandoned rice fields and irrigation canals, much of which is unexplored due to its distance from the boat landings. Paddling completely around this island would allow us to see even more wildlife that we typically can't get to.</p> <p>This trip will be approximately 3 times longer than the SINHG standard kayak trip and will be an estimated duration of 6 hours to get all the way around the island. Applicants should be in good shape and experienced kayakers since there will a tide change during the trip. An outfitter provides the kayaks, lifejackets, and paddles, all you have to do is show up. We will stop for lunch and breaks at a couple of beaches or other areas along the way. <p>The National Weather Service (NWS) is a division of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), which is under the U.S. Department of Commerce. The Charleston National Weather Service office, one of 122 forecast offices across the country, provides weather forecasts and watches/warnings for 8 counties in southeast South Carolina (including Charleston County) and 12 counties in southeast Georgia. They also serve marine interests extending out 20 nautical miles from the southern South Carolina coast and 60 nautical miles off the northern Georgia coast. The NWS Charleston Office is staffed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.</p> <p>On this office tour, we will have the opportunity to tour the operations floor and hear a presentation outlining the National Weather Service agency and how they function day-to-day. The tour includes the upper air building where they launch weather balloons as they provide information on their weather balloon program. They will also provide specific information on weather phenomena that are of greatest interest to us, including hurricanes, thunderstorms, and tornados, and how we can prepare for each occurrence. There will be time and opportunity for questions throughout the tour.</p> <p>Note: All tour attendees must be U.S. citizens, and adults must sign in and show a photo ID. Office tours may be subject to last minute cancellations due to hazardous weather. The fee is a donation to Seabrook Island Natural History Group.</p>

As you explore the historic streets and waterfront, you’ll uncover the stories that reveal how Charleston’s Revolutionary experience helped shape both the war and the city you see today.</p> <p>On this engaging walking tour, you’ll visit key locations connected to Charleston’s role in the Revolutionary War—from the harbor and fortifications that made the city a strategic prize to the streets where British troops marched and patriots resisted. You’ll learn how events like the Battle of Sullivan’s Island and the British occupation of Charleston altered the course of the war in the South.</p> <p>This tour goes beyond generals and battlefield strategy to explore how the war impacted everyday life in Charleston. Through powerful storytelling, you’ll learn about soldiers, civilians struggling to survive occupation, and enslaved people navigating a world transformed by conflict—revealing a city defined by resilience as much as by war.</p>
